MESSAGE FROM CONTRACT DINING



When children eat better they do better, that's how we see it. All our menus are checked and approved by The Children's Food Trust.

A balanced diet consists of starchy foods, fruit and vegetables, meat, fish, eggs, beans and non-dairy sources of protein, milk and dairy. With the emphasis on limited foods high in fat and sugar.

We are the first caterer in Kent

to provide this to all our schools by serving products that are organic, free range, ethically sourced, seasonal fruit and vegetables locally sourced from the South East of England, supporting our local suppliers and farmers.

We are trying very hard to encourage the children to eat their vegetables, we have two hot vegetables to choose from daily, if they wish they can choose salad instead but often this results in them taking cucumber only which is not as satisfying or filling so we do ask they choose 2 salad items.

Here is a quick guide to how

the week looks much healthier for your child:

- Fried potatoes' only twice a week, so this means your roast on Wednesday and chips on a Friday.
- Pastry dishes limited to twice a week.
- Fruit based deserts of at least 50% fresh fruit to be provided twice a week along with fresh fruit as a daily choice.
- Wholegrain rice and pasta, along with the addition of 50% in our homemade bread and cakes is used to get the children taking in more fibre.

- WE DO NOT USE SALT in any of our homemade dishes.

PACKED LUNCH children, if you think you might like school lunches but are unsure, check with your school to see if you can come to lunch for one day as a taster, that way you can pick the day you like the most and hopefully try something different.

RECIPE: CHOCOLATE BROWNIE CAKE

INGREDIENTS

- 100gm Margarine
- 150gm Sugar
- 150gm SR Flour
- 40gm Cocoa Powder
- 2 Eggs
- 2 Small Cooked Beetroot
- 75gm Natural Yoghurt
- 1tsp Bicarbonate of Soda

METHOD

- Cream the margarine and sugar together
- Grate the beetroot
- Mix all ingredients, combine and add the beetroot
- Spoon into a cake tin
- Bake 160-180 degrees for 25-30 minutes.


INCREDIBLE EGGS IN OWL CLASS

MOVING IN!

At last, the moving dates are set, boxes have been packed and the big move takes place during the Easter holidays.

Both floors have big communal spaces that can be equipped to meet the needs of our pupils.

Internally, walls will be knocked down to create larger PMLD classrooms; specialist rooms will be created on the first floor— Science and DT, Art, ICT and Sensory Integration; an Early Years block with their own outside learning area and soft play room; a new nurses room; some more meeting rooms,

offices and training rooms.

The excitement is mounting, as pupils have been into the new building to see their new classroom. Doors have been opened, cupboards investigated and rooms surveyed! Pupils have found classrooms with group rooms attached; two food tech rooms; a designated music room; rooms for soft play and sensory activities; orange toilets for the girls, khaki for the boys and dinosaur for KS1; offices for Tim and Richard; a new lift (that works!!!); and outdoor spaces for all the ground floor classrooms.

This is not the end of the work at the school though! BAM will be with us until the end of April, as they still have the outside areas to complete. We then have the beginning of phase 5, which will involve the completion of the refurbishment of the old build.

We are hopeful that by the beginning of 2018, the building works will be completed and our 'new, improved' building will be being put to excellent use!!

Phase 5 involves the removal of the four huts which will create even more play space for the pupils. We have also secured funding for a sunken trampoline that can accommodate our pupils on their wheelchairs.



FUNDRAISING UPDATE

DOMINOS PIZZA MAKING

Lots of our pupils from Five Acre Wood have been visiting Domino's Dine In Restaurant in Loose to try their hand at pizza making this term.

HORTICULTURE UPDATES

GREGGS FOUNDATION GIFT US A POLYTUNNEL

We were successful in our application to the Greggs Foundation for £1,825 to support one of our new horticulture projects. This will provide a 14'x35' polytunnel which will be large enough for us to have half of it turned over to food production and plant husbandry, where tomatoes and peppers can be grown along with a whole range of other vegetables and salad crops. The other half of the polytunnel will become a teaching and learning environment with staging on both sides.

The polytunnel has an automatic watering system

which will be hugely beneficial over weekends and half terms when school isn't open. It also has an extra internal portable plant protection cloche with plastic cover to provide an ideal micro climate to bring on early fruiting strawberries or salad crops.

This project will be fully accessible to our students who use wheelchairs or who have limited mobility as it has two large sliding doors at either end, as well as raised planters within the tunnel making the task of growing crops in the tunnel more accessible. This means

that it will be accessible to all students within the school, regardless of the level of severity of their individual disabilities.

We have also included the purchase of topsoil and compost in this grant application, so that this grant would encompass the whole project without need for additional support from elsewhere. This means that if we are successful in this grant application we will be able to start the project straight away.

This project will completely transform a derelict area

next to the school car park, into a productive outdoor learning environment. This transformation will massively improve the lives of our students as we enhance their learning and exposure to the world of horticulture, growing and food production.

The polytunnel is nearly built and we are excited to start using it with our pupils!





What can I do to increase my child's attendance?

Only keep your child at home for genuine illness.
Avoid taking holidays in school time.
Parents and Carers have a responsibility to make sure that their children aged 5 to 16 years attend school regularly, on time and receive a full-time education

Late arrival to school

When your child arrives late at school, he/she misses the teacher's instructions and the introduction to the lesson.
Your child may also feel embarrassed at having to enter the classroom late.
School begins at **9.15 a.m.**
Please help your child to be punctual.

What do I need to do if my child is absent?

You must phone on the first day of Absence leaving your child's name, class, reason for absence and expected date of return. Please provide any medical evidence you receive from the doctor.
If your child is still unable to return to school on the expected date, please let us know.
If you have not done any of the above while your child was absent, then you will need to write a letter on your child's **first day** back to school explaining the reason for absence and you must provide medical evidence.

How to apply for your child to be absent during term

Any request for leave are to be made to the Heads of School in writing. The Heads of School will decide if the absence will be authorised after the reason has been given.

A guide for parents and carers



Why is attendance important?

Children need to attend school on a regular basis because it is the key to them doing well at school and sets them up with good habits from an early age through to adulthood.

It also gives children the opportunity to:

- make lots of friends and feel included;
- boost social skills, confidence and self-esteem;
- develop their skills to learn new things;
- achieve their full potential;
- improve their career prospects.

Small changes can make a big difference

Parents and Carers are advised to:

- show your child that you think school is important;
- not keep your child off school if they are worried or have a problem – you should come and talk to TEAM;
- praise your child's achievements;
- recognise that if your child gets into bad habits from an early age, these are hard to break later in life



It is the Law

A child registered at a school can legally miss school only in very limited circumstances. These are:

- when your child is really too ill to attend;
- when the school have authorised the absence beforehand.

If your child is missing without good reason, schools and local authorities have a number of legal powers that they can use.

Authorised Absences include:

- genuine illness resulting with seeing a doctor;
- religious observances;
- family bereavement.

Unauthorised absences include:

- holidays;
- birthday celebrations;
- oversleeping;
- shopping.



How good is my child's attendance?

All pupils are expected to reach levels of at least 95% attendance to be able to access and achieve their full potential at school.

90% attendance might sound good, but...

90% attendance is the same as:

- 1/2 day missed each week
- 20 days in each school year
- a full month out of school

So, 90% is not as good as it first seems.

97% and above = Excellent

95%-97% = Good

90%-95% = Be aware

80%-90% = Worrying – less chance of achieving full potential

Less than 80% = Serious concerns – referral to Early Help and/or School Liaison Officer
