# The Value of the arts

Things are progressing well and we are really beginning to see the benefits and impact that an arts-enriched curriculum can have on our pupils and staff. The World Health Organisation has just published a report emphasising the positive effects the arts can have on our health and wellbeing throughout our lives. For example, reading to young children before bed can improve sleeping habits and concentration at school. Later in life, music can support cognition in people with dementia. Singing, in particular, has been found to improve attention, episodic memory and executive function.
