### BTECS

**SPORT** 

For BTEC Sports, we had the opportunity to collaborate with Maidstone Football Club, playing football matches and participating in football skills lessons alongside Cedarwood Class. The pupils also got to teach a PE lesson over at our Snodland site. They each had to do a lesson plan for the lessons they were teaching, including a warmup comprising of dynamic stretches, and a skill. The progress the pupils made in planning and teaching could be seen when they taught two other lessons to the Formal Secondary pupils. The BTEC Sport pupils also got to attend a session at the Core Gym in Maidstone where they completed a circuit session of all different skills in the gym.



### **MAINTENANCE**



The pupils learning BTEC Maintenance have transformed the yard at the Loose site, cleared the meadow area, and built a new fence. Furthermore, the group has laid animal pen foundations as well as new paving areas. They have also built a water harvesting system to stop the meadow from flooding, have installed new guttering, water butts and taps. Foundations have also been laid for a new aviary which is very exciting. Pupils worked to Paul's specifications and high standards, wrote risk assessments, learnt how to use new power tools, developed their teamwork, improved their work skills and worked to deadlines.



### **ART**

BTEC Art group went to Maidstone Museum for a self-led visit. It was a great chance to explore a mix of art and history exhibits. Pupils observed various artworks, took notes, and got inspired for their art



projects. It was all about enjoying the museum, sketching, and discovering new ideas for their BTEC Art coursework. Back in June, pupils took part in

an art competition organised by KArtsCon where two of our pupils received second and third place in the 12-18 category. The Mayor of Medway presented the prizes at the Sunlight Development Hall in Gillingham on Tuesday 09<sup>th</sup> July. This was a proud moment for the BTEC ART group, highlighting the talent and hard work of the pupils.

### SPORTS DAYS

of the evening was melting marshmallows and making smores. The pupils were safe and sensible around the fire and thoroughly enjoyed the experience.








By 8:45 pm, the campfire was

There have been so many











new words being said in class with Poppy saying her first word 'again', and Melissa saying lots of her peers names.





### FOXGLOVE CLASS




Foxglove Class have had a splashing term and have loved accessing

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


We have continued to learn about independence


### **NUMBER HEROES COMPETITION**

### NOTE TO PARENTS/CARERS REGARDING MEDICATION

To ensure that your child is given the most current prescribed medication of the correct dose and at the right time, please read these guidelines:

- 1. Please ensure that all medicines sent into school are in the ORIGINAL pharmacy containers/packaging clearly labelled with:
  - Your child's name
  - Name of prescribed medication
  - The dosage and frequency of administration
  - How medicine should be given, e.g. by mouth, via feeding tube
  - Date medicine was dispensed
  - Expiry Date

Any nurse will have the right to refuse the administration of medication to your child if this information is not clearly shown on the label.

- 2. Please inform the school nurse of any change to your child's regular medication, including alterations to dose, frequency or medication being stopped as advised by a doctor. These alterations need to be confirmed in writing by the prescriber. We cannot accept verbal alterations and will be unable to give an amended dose unless we have the medication in its original contained with the correct information printed on the label or receive the changes in writing from the prescriber.
- 3. If your child is prescribed emergency medication (Diazepam/Midazolam for epilepsy or Anapen/Epipen for allergy) please inform the school nurse immediately. Further information from your child's doctor will be needed regarding when the emergency medication should be given and this will be kept in school so all staff are aware of what care your child needs in an emergency.
- 4. Please ensure there is a sufficient supply of all the medicines your child needs whilst in school. We will contact you to advise when we are running low.
- 5. When sending in medication, it must not be put in your child's bag. Instead, it should be handed directly to a member of the class staff. If your child comes into school by taxi, the medication should be given to the escort who will then hand it to a member of the class staff when they arrive at school.
