

Wright class is a year 12, 13 & and 14 group with 13 pupils, a Class Teacher, a Senior Teaching Assistant and 1 Teaching Assistant. Our class is based at our 6th form satellite site at Oxford Road. We are pleased to have an additional year 14 pupil and a healthcare assistant from another 6th form class joining us daily.

Wright class pupils have settled well in their new class and have started to adapt to their new learning setting and curriculum. All pupils are working towards completing new accreditations linked to their functional pathway.

Pupils transition to a variety of learning areas within the school and to numerous places in the local community, so that they access a well-fitted personalised curriculum within their learning pathway.

Pupils enjoy learning and taking part in problem solving activities and discussions, where they share their ideas and viewpoints and support each other. They enjoy celebrating each other's achievements and display the school's positive attitude by following the school's values responsibly.

Pupils are encouraged to continue to develop their sense of responsibility, their life skills, communication skills and their growth mindset, so that they can continue develop their independence and confidence in taking on an active role in their immediate community and in their wider communities. This helps them to secure ways to help them to manage future challenges with greater confidence and self-efficacy.

Wright class pupils work towards being part of the world outside of school. They learn about workplace expectations and future independent or assisted home-life settings. These standards are set in school during practical work, work experiences and during functional learning in class. Pupils choose their vocational activities and engage in enrichment activities. The latter is to support them to develop their personal targets, so that they feel better prepared when they transition to the post-19 provision of their choice.

Wright class pupils are looking forward to embracing the new learning experiences offered in our 6th form Functional pathway and to continue to develop the skills they respectively need for the future.
